



Supporting professional development in stroke and neurorehabilitation care

Training and education report 2022

1. Background

The Greater Manchester Neurorehabilitation Network and Greater Manchester Integrated Stroke Delivery Network formally merged in October 2021. This report captures the activity from our first year as a fully merged network during 2022.

The development of local professionals involved with providing care and support to patients and their families is a priority for the network. The network's Training and Education Subgroup is drawn from a range of healthcare professionals from local inpatient and community clinical teams, with additional representation from local voluntary sector organisations and academics.

It aims to:

- Scope and collate current training provision, identify training needs and gaps in provision
- Develop new and/or co-ordinate existing training opportunities/materials and disseminate locally
- Develop/promote training competencies for stroke and neurorehabilitation care
- Work with other stakeholders to address NHS staff shortages
- Encourage sharing of best practice and peer support

Our [website](#) signposts local and national training events and courses and provides details of other online resources for stroke and community neurorehabilitation care. There are also tailored online training packages for stroke care and other E-Learning packages available on the website.

2. Key achievements of 2022

During 2022, post pandemic, the network has provided a hybrid package of training with some events held virtually in the form of webinars and some returning to face to face. Our training activity included:

- **9 webinars** - all uploaded to the network's [YouTube channel](#)
- **7 face to face events** - one was also broadcast as a webinar and two were live streamed via our YouTube channel
- **7927 views** of our training videos on our YouTube channel - we gained an extra **171** subscribers to the channel during the year
